

BAVARIAN & AUSTRIAN ALPS

DAY 1 – Lake Chiemsee – Berchtesgaden



Lake Chiemsee is Bavaria's largest lake and is actually the remains of a former glacier. There are traces of prehistoric settlements on the three islands jutting out of the lake. Berchtesgaden national park is a picture-book conservation area. Germany's only alpine national park is unparalleled in its beauty, an area rich in plant and animal life and a great place to go for rest and recuperation. Rare plants, marmots, chamois and ibex have found sanctuary in the national park. Check-in for a 3-night-stay in Berchtesgaden. (approx. 165 km)

DAY 2 – Lake District & Salzburg



Millions of people around the world recognize the lake district near Salzburg from the movie classic "The Sound of Music". Spectacular lakes surrounded by imposing mountains provide the backdrop for rewarding explorations. Walk along the crystal clear waters of Lake Wolfgangsee and Lake Fuschlsee, where you can board a steamship to get from one place to another. Salzburg, the birthplace of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, is dominated by churches, castles and palaces. Its picturesque old town is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. (approx. 170 km)

DAY 3 – Grossglockner Mountain & Kitzbühel



The most famous alpine road leads you into the heart of the Hohe Tauern National Park, to the highest mountain in Austria, the Grossglockner (3,798m) and its glacier. You will have a driving and nature experience of a special kind on 48 kilometres of high alpine road with 36 bends, and an altitude ascent to 2,504 metres! You pass through a unique world of mountains with blossoming alpine meadows, forests, massive cliffs and eternal ice to the foot of the Grossglockner. On return-way you can make a stop in the VIP-alpine-resort of Kitzbühel. (approx. 350 km)

DAY 4 – Berchtesgaden – Innsbruck – Garmisch-Partenkirchen



Innsbruck - Tyrol's capital is a living treasure house of history and culture. Its unique natural backdrop ideally complements Innsbruck's rich cultural heritage. Innsbruck offers its visitors sophistication, charm and Alpine exhilaration. Visit the famous Golden Roof, the Court Church, the Imperial Palace, Ambras Castle and the well-known Swarovski Crystal Worlds. Continue your journey north to the Bavarian mountain-resort of Garmisch-Partenkirchen and check-in for 3-night-stay. (approx. 220 km)

Day 5 – Royal Castles of Bavarian Alps



Drive western along the German Alpine Road to Füssen and visit there the most famous Neuschwanstein Castle, built for King Ludwig II between 1869 and 1886 on a rugged cliff. The magnificent alpine backdrop is straight out of a picture-book, with lush green meadows and dark forests. Magnificent Linderhof Palace stands on the site of a former hunting lodge. King Ludwig II was dazzled by the opulence of the Bourbon court and aspired to create a replica of the palace and park of Versailles. (approx. 130 km)

Day 6 – Zugspitze Mountain



A trip up the Zugspitze, Germany's highest mountain (2,962 metres) with the rack-railway and the cable car is a "must" for any visitor. The panoramic views of the surrounding peaks are unparalleled. And when you reach the top, there is even an art gallery to visit. The Wetterstein mountains provide a suitable challenge for mountain sports enthusiasts, but you don't have to be an extreme sports fan, there are plenty of well-maintained footpaths suitable for everyone. (Within Garmisch no car needed)

Day 7 – Munich



With its famous onion domes, the 15th century Gothic Church of Our Lady is Munich's unmistakable landmark. Not far away, at Marienplatz, the carillon plays three times a day. And just a stone's throw from here is probably the most famous tavern in the world, the Hofbräuhaus beer hall. Don't miss the green sights of Munich with the English Garden, the gardens of Nymphenburg Palace or the royal Renaissance garden of Hofgarten Palace. (approx. 130 km)
